1. Welcome

The meeting was called to order at 2:00pm by Jack McAlinden.

2. Items for Discussion

The purpose of this agenda item is to discuss issues which affects a multitude of Faculties or the whole student body.

1) Minutes and Action Points from 30^{th} November

The committee was asked to look at the action points table from the previous meeting held in November. This has now been updated accordingly below.

2) Education Network Blog

Following Novembers meeting, Joe has written two blogs to be published on the Education Network page on the Union website. The committee discussed how to ensure the page had a maximum reach. There was a consensus to link the blog post with Bristol SU marketing team through Robiu. Joe asked the committee for a volunteer to write the next post, Jack offered to do so.

3) Substitution Provisions for Paperless Departments
This item was brought forward following Novembers meeting. The committee
was asked to discuss what provisions could be made in departments where

there is a paperless policy. Jack suggested emailing the University Estates department on behalf of the network to encourage more plug points in any new refurbishments planned. The committee agreed for Jack to go ahead but there were questions regarding the cost and disruption of installing new plug points. Helen suggested an alternative to areas where plug points might not be feasible, to have 'Trolley charging points'. The committee agreed that this would be a suitable alternative. Jack will include this in his communication with Estates.

4) Course Rep Democratic Forum

The Education Network was established this year as part of the Bristol SU democracy review. Part of the remit of the Education Network is to hold at least 1 democratic forum a term with its members. The purpose of the forums is to agree on campaigns and policy priority for the Network and collaborate with the University on key strategic educational projects. This term's forum will be on Wednesday 7th of March at 16:00–18:00 at Bristol SU, Richmond Building, Fourth Floor, Gromit Room 4.77. The topic for the forum is assessment and this will be in collaboration with BUILT. All Faculty Reps are expected to attend. Full details of the forum can be found here.

The committee was asked to discuss ideas to add to the forum and what the social at the end should be. It was agreed that there will be a Faculty Representative update at the start, followed by a workshop on assessment, split by similarity of assessment rather than by faculty. Afterwards, there will be a social which will include; free food, bar access, live band or karoke with Music.

5) UCU Strike

Mason Ammar provided an update on the Union response to the UCU strike. Details of this can be found here. Questions were asked regarding the impact the strikes will have on students and how reps can communicate the ways to address problems regarding student queries on the strike action. Mason Ammar suggested having an email/working document to create an FAQ for reps about the strikes. Clarification was asked regarding roles of reps in attending FSSLCs and SSLCs. Mason confirmed that he would speak to UCU about this and email the response to Faculty Reps. Mason made clear that Education Network activities like the upcoming Forum will still go ahead as it's held by Bristol SU and not the University.

4. Any Other Business

4.1 Contextualise Offers

HI raised the issue that some students are concerned with regards to the level of contextualise offers UOB give to students who are already high achieving. Jack added that there have been cases whereby people decide not to come to Bristol because they put their offers as insurance rather than firm choice. The committee discussed whether the institution should change the way the contextualise offers are made. It was suggested that the offers should be made to be the firm first choice to avoid the situation where some courses are not filled through choices but by clearing process. It was agreed that Reps should raise this at their FSSLCs and see what the response from their Faculty.
